In 2011 the Council formed the Utility Advisory Committee (UAC) to make policy recommendations to the Council concerning stormwater utility rates, the collection of funds, and the purpose for which they shall be used. The UAC is to consist of a minimum of three, but not more than five residents. There is a vacancy that needs to be filled on the UAC, and Mayor Harris has recommended Steve Fleming to fill that vacancy.
